
Lorraine and John Mouery started a mission in a mobile home park just behind central Florida's Boardwalk and Baseball amusement park in 1987.

Having held worship services in the park's clubhouse, Discipleship Baptist Mission has grown in two years to 125 members, half of whom were baptized by bivocational pastor Mouery. Many of the members have overcome lives of abuse, alcohol and drug addictions.

Although they have few financial resources, they desire a permanent meeting facility to serve as a lighthouse of hope for others. Slowly their dream may start to become a reality. A site grant from the Maguire State Mission Offering provided the congregation with a down payment to purchase a nearby piece of property.

Through the Maguire State Mission Offering, Florida Baptists are responding to God's mission. Our responses by praying and giving are not options, but a mandate from God.



Crises...

suffering, adversity and need are often the vehicles God uses to awaken me to a new and exciting truth from God as well as new and exciting truths about God. The past weeks have been filled with suffering, adversity and need. I've never seen so many hurting people--nor have I experienced as much suffering.

The hurting...

moments are many and varied.

- For one, it's cancer.
- For another, it's a fatal accident.
- For others, it's the horror of drug addiction.
- For another, it's the loss of a loved one.
- For still others it's...well--you get the picture. My world, your world is filled with confused, broken, hurting, wounded people. Without exception I hear why? Why me? Why now? Why this?

How do we respond? What do we say? Is there a word that brings hope or healing or help?

The world...

of deeply hurting people was brought home to me recently in the death of our daughter-in-law's 36-year-old brother. I felt, sensed, and saw the questions, the hurt, the difficulty of coping with the ravages of death.

I also saw the family--anchored in Christ--unable to answer why--unwilling to be destroyed by death, resolutely turn their face to Jesus and walk through the dark valley safely in His care.

This Church...

family has a responsibility to be! To be:

- the healing salve of God;
- the place of gentle love;
- an oasis of hope;
- patient and kind and caring and tolerant;
- seekers of the hurting in order to be used of God to bring healing and hope.

The hurting are us! The needy? Us! We must work at keeping our lines of support intact because crises and suffering and adversity and need know no boundary.

I'll see you here Sunday--1500 strong prepared to study together.


