ELECTION OF DEACONS

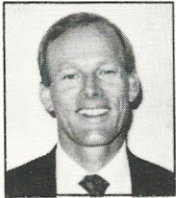

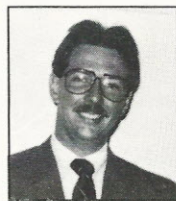

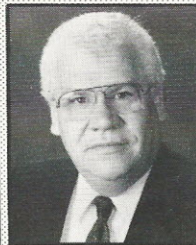
