Sunday was a beautiful day on the outside, and also a beautiful day on the inside as our worship services were well attended.



The music was outstanding, and we had eight new members who joined with us. The adult choirs from the two morning worship services joined together on Sunday evening and did a terrific job.

THE SUNDAY SCHOOL . . . continues to do well. We have averaged nearly 1450 since January 8. Every area of the Sunday School is doing well. Our singles are overflowing. They have been around 200 each Sunday. We are making plans to begin another Singles class which should help us push our attendance up to about 220 or 230 in the singles area. We are also making plans to start another Median Adult Department in the next month or so. I am just so pleased with your response to Bible study.

I RECEIVED SOME INFORMATION . . . this week about the Southern Florida Satellite Assembly that our State Convention is building near LaBelle, Florida. For years, all of Florida Baptists used Lake Yale. Then, in recent years, Blue Springs Assembly was built, and we have greatly benefited from this in North Florida and in the panhandle. Now, with the mushrooming growth in South Florida, we need another Satellite Assembly there. I wanted you to know about this so that we can join with Florida Baptists in our prayer and support of this new assembly.

OUR THREE NEW VANS . . . have arrived. I want to say a special word of thanks to the one whose gift made these vans possible. They will be extremely useful in the continuation of our ministry.

THIS SUNDAY . . . I will be preaching on I Corinthians in all the services. The message Sunday morning will be from I Corinthians 9. The evening message will come from I Corinthians 10. The evening service will also feature a baptismal service. Then, after the service is the all church fellowship in the CAC and the first annual Staff-Deacon Shoot-out. I'll see you here for another exciting day.
