A Look At Our Association ASSOCIATIONAL EMPHASIS WEEK

Pensacola Bay Baptist Association is a fellowship of 62 Southern Baptist Churches and three church type missions in Escambia County and Gulf Breeze. The Association was organized on September 1, 1887, as the 16th Association in the Florida Baptist Convention.

The structure of the Association is determined by its purpose of helping local churches; thus parallels the organization of a local church. Most of its workers are volunteers from the churches, people with training and experience which they are willing to share in helping workers in other churches. Much of the work of the Association is done through conferences, clinics, workshops and training sessions in which local church workers find help for performing their work. On request, associational workers will conduct some helpful activities within a single church, but most often several churches are involved.

Cooperative ventures through the Association grow as the population of the area increases and as the needs of the churches change. Some of these are: Camp Ada, Baptist Campus Ministry, Port Ministry, Religious Education / Christian Social Ministries, and an area office for Florida Baptist Children's Homes. In each of these areas professional staff members are employed; some full-time and some part-time.

The Association is your chance to be a mission in our community to the world.

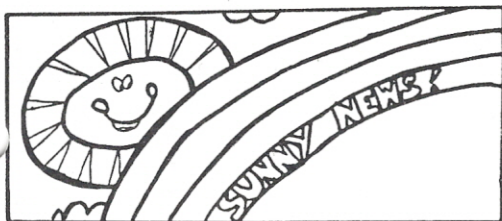
