SANCTUARY REPAIR UPDATE

Plaster and Paint Work Completed

Thanks to careful guidance by the Building and Grounds Committee and Saturday work by our janitorial force, the Sanctuary has been clean and ready for Sunday services during the last eight weeks of plaster and painting work on our worship center.

The plaster repair contractor worked on tearing out and replacing water-damaged plaster around several stained glass windows and in the foyer over a period of four weeks.

Each Monday the scaffolding was installed and each Friday it was removed, along with the special padding and plastic sheeting that protected pews and paneling.

After a "curing" period of two weeks, the paint contractor began the two weeks of work needed to complete the surface preparation and painting.

Book of Remembrance in Place

Due to the above mentioned repairs, the case containing the Book of Remembrance was removed for safekeeping while the workmen moved equipment in and out and made extensive plaster repair in the alcove of the foyer where the book is displayed.

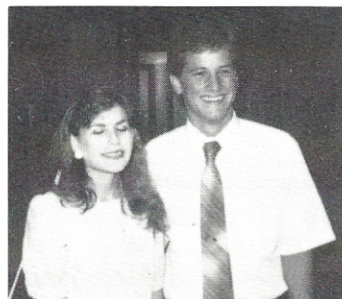

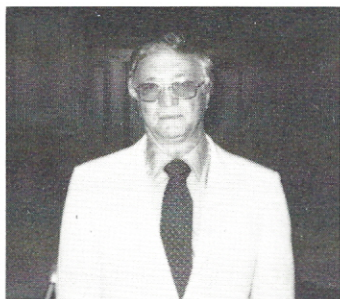

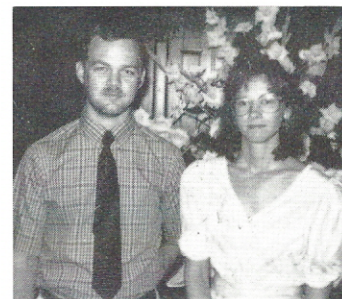
