

## MISSION MATTERS

Vital to the nature of First Baptist Church is our interest in mission matters. The Missions Committee is presently at work on a number of concerns that we want you to be aware of.

First of all, we congratulate Hong Dang on his ordination to the ministry. Hong works with Southeast Asians at every opportunity, and we hope to be able to put even greater emphasis on ministering to this group in the future.

Second, Eddie Benton and a group of our young people recently held a week of Backyard Bible Club meetings in connection with the Government Street Mission. After making contacts at many homes in the area, they had 22 young people at the first session and reached 48 by the last day. Most of those attending already have church homes but need weekday ministries.

Opportunities are there for service from our people, but after really diligent investigation and prayer, the decision has been made not to recommend that the church undertake formal sponsorship of the Mission. After consultations with the Mission pastor, the Associational Director and Missions Committee, the pastor of the original sponsoring church, and our church staff, the consensus of opinion is that we need to look in another direction for an involvement of this type.

The Barton Starrs will be leaving the missionary house this week, returning to their field of service in Hong Kong. We appreciate so much their participation with us during their stay here. The Gary Whites from Jordan will move in early in September. In the meantime further efforts are being made to get the house into excellent condition and to make those provisions which will facilitate their making quick adjustments and having a pleasant stay.

Finally, Praya Mam's youngest brother, Chinthai Kong, was located with a family in California, and with the assistance of the Missions Committee was flown to Pensacola to make his home with Praya and his sister. We continue to work on the immigration of other family members to the United States.

Please be in prayer for your Missions Committee as we continue to seek God's direction for the mission outreach of FBC.
