FBC PRAYER MINISTRY

"If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you." John 15:7

Have you ever thought about the meaning of the common word *abide*? It means to dwell in or sojourn with, to conform to or to comply with. How do we abide in God and allow His words to abide in us? We need to spend time with Him in daily Bible study and prayer. Until we become steeped in the Word, love the Word, and live the Word, we cannot abide in Him very well. How much time do we spend reading and studying the Bible compared to the time we spend with the *News-Journal*, the *Wall Street Journal*, professional literature, escape fiction, favorite secular magazines, etc.? We need to analyze carefully the words that abide in us. Are we spending enough time in God's Word, enough, that is, to be able to discern His will in our lives? Our prayer times will be greatly enriched as we learn to pray as scripture directs.
