## Brian's Lines

Next Sunday is going to be a special day. I know we will have a great crowd in our morning worship service. But our real focus this week is on the Sunday evening service. Our goal is 1040, 1000 plus 40



to celebrate my birthday the next day when I will reach that new plateau in my life. I hope you will come worship with us Sunday evening and be a part of the tremendous time of fellowship, singing, and inspiration. There will be a party

for all of the children, grades 1-5, in the Christian Activity Center. That will begin at 5:00. The Middle Schoolers have their JOY, and the High Schoolers are in choir. Then, for adults, we have the Joyce Landorf film. I hope all of you will come at 5:00 and stay right on through the time of fellowship following the service.

IT IS THAT TIME OF YEAR . . . when we focus on our budget challenge. Our Budget Planning Committee has worked long and hard in preparing this year's budget. We will discuss it as a church and vote on it, Wednesday night, November 14. It is a strong budget (slightly more than 11% increase over last year's budget). By the way, since 1978, we have averaged increasing our budget giving by 11.7% each year. So our proposed budget is in line with our possibilities that have been demonstrated over the last six years. The budget will increase our Cooperative Program giving by another percent to 20% of our total budget. There are some other steps to enhance our mission involvement that are included in this year's budget. The program ministries in every area are increased so that we can continue to provide the ministries that you and your family need. Be much in prayer for this process the next few weeks as we move toward Pledge Day, November 18.

A LARGE PART . . . of our secondary renovation has been done, but we are still waiting on choir chairs, pew cushions, and some work to be done in the foyer of the sanctuary. Bill Santo is moving the project along nicely. Soon, it will be finished. I am thrilled with what has already been done. We are hoping to have ready in the next couple of months a comprehensive plan that will plot out some future building projects that we need to undertake, while at the same

## FBC Prayer Ministry

*“And in the morning, rising up a great while before day, he went out, and departed into a solitary place, and there prayed.” (Mark 1:35)*

If you read the preceding 34 verses in Mark 1, you will see that this was a very busy time in Jesus's earthly ministry. Verse 33 shows he was still working as the “sun did set.” Oftentimes we in the twentieth century think we have cornered the market on demanding schedules; however, as we read of Jesus's long day and demanding pressures we see that we are not alone. In the focal passage we see what Jesus did, though, as he faced another busy day. He did not just “hope” everything would turn out right; he devoted the early morning to prayer to His Father, seeking guidance and strength for each day.

Like Jesus, we find our lives filled with opportunities for service and pressed by great needs. In these times, however, we should not yield to the temptation to give less time to prayer and reading His Word.

Jesus said, “As my Father hath taught me, I speak . . .” (John 8:28). If we follow Jesus's example, we will spend much time in prayer and have this same assurance.


